Creativity

- Identify opportunities to create solutions to real world problems

- Develop a 'make it happen' attitude by using novel ideas as solutions to real world problems



Communication

- Capable of making appropriate, respectful choices about communication modes and tools to express your ideas and get your message across

Critical Thinking

- Determine whether information is trustworthy, relevant and useful
- Identify unfounded assumptions, faulty reasoning and unjustified conclusions by asking questions that evaluate the evidence
- Clearly explain your own reasoning to show good insight & clarity of thinking enabling you to justify your arguments and draw conclusions
- Apply critical thinking, logic and reasoning to evaluate your own ideas and processes & take action that makes a difference, based on what was discovered

- Develop strengths and weaknesses of self and others
- Contribute ideas
- Take a variety of roles
- Develop positive relationships
- Respectfully explore different opinions
- Use digital elements to support your work
